(ACCME Accreditation Requirements and Descriptions, Updated June 2014, pg. 15.) A provider must disclose the above information to learners prior to the beginning of the educational activity. (ACCME SCS6.5) Individuals who refuse to disclose are disqualified from being a planning committee member, teacher, or author of CME, and cannot have control of, or responsibility for, the development, management, presentation or evaluation of a CME activity. (ACCME SCS2.2)

• ACCME's Policy on Content Validation: All the recommendations involving clinical medicine in a CME activity must be based on evidence that is accepted within the profession of medicine as adequate justification for their indications and contraindications in the care of patients. All scientific research referred to, reported or used in CME in support or justification of a patient care recommendation must conform to the generally accepted stands of experimental design, data collection and analysis.
