

Hurley Announces Partnership with Epic Systems for Most Advanced, World Class, Healthcare Software

Hurley Medical Center's vision to be a leader in improving health care delivery is demonstrated in its new partnership with Epic Systems for the most advanced healthcare software in the world. This new system allows Hurley to implement an integrated electronic medical record that will allow for improvements to the safety and quality in our inpatient and outpatient environments.

"The new Epic system will replace the current mix of electronic and paper processes and systems currently in use today. This will improve access to patient information, quality of patient care and overall patient experience, reduce redundant staff activity, and

enhance Hurley's standing as a community teaching hospital and research center of excellence," says Patrick Wardell, Hurley President and Chief Executive Officer.

Hurley has entered into an agreement with Epic Systems Corporation. Epic provides Hurley Medical Center access to all of its clinical, ancillary and revenue cycle software applications. Epic software is fully integrated across the continuum of care, which means a single patient-centric record is used wherever our patients receive service. "Thanks to this new technology, doctors will be able to track orders and results - even from home, and patients will have access to their own records and will be able to make



appointments and informed decisions about their care," adds Wardell.

Over the next 18 to 21 months, Hurley Medical Center will replace its core clinical systems and processes with the integrated Epic inpatient, ambulatory and emergency department functionality. Hurley will be using the Epic's Model System implementation methodology, based on the best practices of more than 190 Epic customers. Many physicians attended presentations in March on Epic's capabilities. Additional sessions are being scheduled. The new Epic system is expected to go live in 2011.

We will keep you posted on the milestones of this important project.

The event highlighted a young boy, Archer Granger, who was airlifted to Hurley Medical Center in August, 2009 after his foot was 95% severed by a riding lawn mower on a farm near Brown City. Over 40 Hurley physicians, nurses, and medical staff were able to save the boy's foot. Although he was not expected to walk, he was "running" by November, thanks to the medical care at Hurley.

"I am so thankful for the excellent care Archer recieved, and the amazing support and warmth from your medical staff," Archer's mom Jennifer Granger said. "Hurley is the place to go for children. I'll never go anywhere else. I am so grateful to Hurley and believe Archer's recovery is a complete miracle. Hurley saved his life - and his legs."

Patient and Family-Centered Care Update

Hurley now has a Patient and Family-Centered Care Steering Committee. The committee membership is multidisciplinary with representation from the hospital board, administration, medicine, nursing, support services and two patient and family advisors to represent our health care customers and the community. The team met for the first time in February and will be working to implement patient and family-centered care as the model of care delivery at Hurley Medical Center.

The committee's first order of business is to complete a hospital self-assessment inventory, which will provide us with a picture of our current status as it relates to patient and family-centered care. Using the assessment as a tool we will be able to prioritize the next steps needed for implementation and develop an action plan for the advancement of PFCC. The steering committee, along with several physician leaders and members of Hurley senior leadership will attend

an intensive training seminar conducted by the Institute for Family-Centered Care.

This is an exciting time and an opportunity to be a part of something bigger than ourselves as we begin what truly will be a journey of culture transformation. 

Physician Parking Update

Beginning April 19, physicians will park in Lot J (near the Laundry). Physicians will enter the parking from Patrick Street and leave the lot on Begole Street.



Physicians may access the hospital by a "Restricted Access" door located at ground level just west of the current entrance. By entering here, physicians can go up one flight of stairs to arrive at the back entrance of the Physician Lounge or Resident Lounge. Or if you prefer, you may enter through the laundry "atrium" and follow the signs through General Services and take the elevator up one floor. Patient parking will remain the same at this time.
