

Hurley Hosts Governor Granholm at Groundbreaking for Paul F. Reinhart **Emergency Trauma Center**

On April 27, 2010, Hurley broke ground on the new Paul F. Reinhart Emergency Trauma Center. The medical milestone in Dort Park was attended by Governor Jennifer Granholm, City of Flint Mayor Dayne Walling,

Hurley Board of Managers, and a host of Flint, Genesee County and state elected officials and quests.

The late Paul F. Reinhart devoted his career to advocating for Michigan Medicaid patients and

hospitals like Hurley. For many years, Reinhart fought to improve the flexibility and accessibility of the Medicaid program to reach out to the state's growing numbers of unemployed and low-income families.

Before he passed, Reinhart was the Director of Medical Services Administration of the Michigan Department of Community Health.

plans to double in size by 2011. "The goal is to build a brand-new, from-scratch emergency trauma center that basically doubles the size of the facility we have right now," said Hurley CEO Patrick Wardell, "We'll use

the one we have now until we build the new one, then we'll turn the lights off and move over."

The expansion has been in the works for years, with an ED created to accommodate

> 55,000 patients a year that routinely handles nearly 80,000 patients a year, including some of the most seriously injured accident victims in the region.

Hurley's new capital project will offer a greatly expanded and improved upon Lobby and ED facility starting with a drop off lane in front of new main, adult ED and pediatric ED entrance. Upon entering the building employees and patients will find themselves in a roomy 9,000 square foot lobby with





Hurley Plastic Surgery Services



Stephen A. Morris, MD is a plastic surgeon who recently joined Hurley Trauma Services. Dr. Morris is certified by the American Board of Plastic Surgery and the American Board of Surgery. His interests are in reconstructive surgery including hand surgery, soft tissue injuries of the face, fractures of the facial skeleton, burns and other

complex wounds. Hand surgery includes fractures of the hand and carpal bones, soft tissue injuries of the hand and forearm including tendon, ligament, nerve and blood vessels. Replantation services are not available at this time, however, opinions can be rendered. Fractures of the radius and ulna and elbow injuries would be handled as in the past by the orthopedic surgery service.

Dr. Morris recently practiced in Saginaw, has served with the U.S. Army and has worked overseas.

Last month was a busy time for the Epic implementation at Hurley. The end of March and the beginning of April saw our project team attending as many as 80 hours of classroom training on the configuration and use of the Epic software. Project leadership worked closely with Epic on some fine details of the project and technology plans. The end of April had a team of Epic's implementation specialists here to help us formally kick-off the project. During their three day visit, they went with our implementation team

to visit many of our major care areas to assess system configuration needs and performed software demonstrations of key system functionality to physicians and Hurley staff.

The next major milestone in the project will be in the first week of June when Epic returns to review the initial configuration of the system with Hurley. The second validation sessions will follow shortly after that. Keep looking for this spot in the Physician Connection for additional information and upcoming additional demonstrations.

increased seating and views of Dort Park.

ED patients and staff will pass through an 8 room triage area to get to the 64 treatment, acute, psych, and clinical decision rooms that are contained within the flexibly and efficiently designed ED. The new rooms and department will boast significant improvements including up to a 50% increase in size over existing rooms, all private rooms supporting adult and pediatric patients, improved adjacencies and operability, separation of traffic, improved security, warmth and atmosphere, decreased noise levels,

and integration of new technologies.

The new ED would take over the entire main floor of the east wing, which is the long corridor off the parking garage, then extend out another 25,000 square feet toward Fifth Avenue for a total of 50,000 square feet. The main lobby would also be relocated to face Fifth Avenue.

The hospital plans to work with local contractors and labor for the construction phase, as an economic multiplier for the area. The construction project is expected to be completed by January, 2012.
