Hurley Receives Genesee County's First and Only Designation from

National Accreditation Program (NAPBC) for Breast Centers

Hurley Medical Center
was granted a threeyear accreditation
designation by the
National Accreditation
Program for Breast
Centers (NAPBC), a
program administered
by the American
College of Surgeons. Hurley
is the first and only medical
center in Genesee County to
receive this distinction - out
of a total of only six medical
facilities statewide.

"Accreditation by the NAPBC is only given to those centers that have voluntarily committed to provide the highest level of quality breast care and that undergo a rigorous evaluation process and review of their performance. Hurley Medical Center provides the most outstanding clinical care and compassion for patients and their families, and we are proud to have earned this accreditation," says Raouf A. Mikhail, MD, FACS, FRCS (C), Hurley Chair, Department of Surgery, and Director, Hurley Breast Program. During the survey process, the center must demonstrate compliance with standards established by the NAPBC

for treating women who are diagnosed with the full spectrum of breast disease. The standards include proficiency in the areas of: center leadership, clinical management, research, community outreach, professional education, and quality improvement.

"A breast center that achieves NAPBC accreditation has demonstrated a firm commitment to offer its patients every significant advantage in their battle against breast disease. Hurley's Breast Health Nurse Navigator Program provides the latest information and research, and connects patients with resources for nutrition, lifestyle, emotional, and spiritual support, demonstrating our commitment to providing patient and family focused care at a very stressful time in these patients' lives," says Marsha Schmit, RN, BSN, Hurley's Breast Health Nurse

Navigator - the only program of its kind in Genesee County.

The NAPBC is

a consortium of professional organizations dedicated to the improvement of the quality of care and monitoring of outcomes of patients with diseases of the breast. This mission is pursued through standard-setting, scientific validation, and patient and professional education. Its board membership includes professionals from 15 national organizations that reflect the full spectrum of breast care.

The American Cancer Society (ACS) estimated that there would be 192,370 patients diagnosed with invasive breast cancer in the United States in 2009. In addition, hundreds of thousands of women who will deal with benign breast disease this year will require medical evaluation for treatment options.

Paul F. Reinhart Emergency **Trauma Center Construction Shows Great Progress**

Beginning with the big groundbreaking celebration in April, passersby on Grand Traverse and Fifth Avenue have watched as Hurley's Paul F. Reinhart Emergency Trauma Center has taken shape. Now that the building is enclosed and the main drive loop has been roughed in, the construction is really starting to look like the architectural rendering.

With winter here, the focus has shifted to interior construction. Everything is on schedule for the new lobby opening in August 2011. The wall framing is 50% complete. The mechanical, electrical, and plumbing infrastructure is 35% complete and the exterior building enclosure is 95% complete. Demolition of the Ground Floor East is also 95% complete and

the wall layout and track installation is beginning. In addition, the ductwork and overhead piping is underway in the basement.

The construction progress may not be as obvious as you drive by this winter, but we'll continue to update you with information and photos!



Architectural Rendering



Radiology Services is pleased to announce that there is one more modality available for diagnostic imaging right here on the Hurley campus. Our new MRI (magnetic resonance imaging) unit has

arrived, and will be operational the latter part of January, 2011. This is the only hospital based MRI in the community which provides yet another level of safety for those patients that choose Hurley. The location of the MRI is right outside of the ED Prompt Care waiting area, and has its own waiting room and entrance.



The location will provide easy access to both inpatients, outpatients and Emergency Department patients.

> The 450W is one of GE's latest innovations in the field of MRI. It has a wide bore that will accommodate larger patients and improve patient comfort. This bore is 20 cm larger than other MRI units in our area. It will also provide superior images on all types of patients from the neonate to adult. We will also offer breast imaging with our new state of the art system.

Annual Medical Staff Meeting

The Annual Medical Staff Meeting held on December 8, 2010 at the Flint Golf Club was well attended. Following are some highlights from the meeting:

- Minutes of May 2010 General Medical Staff Meeting and Actions of the MEC June – December, 2010 were approved by the members present.
- An aspect of the Bylaws change regarding personal order sets will be discussed at the January Medical Executive Committee. The Bylaws change was approved by the membership as recommended by MEC.
- Mr. Wardell highlighted the ED project, Epic implementation, other significant milestones at the Medical Center, and opportunities for physician engagement.
- Dr. Jaggi gave a brief report on the 2011 PRC Loyalty (Physician Satisfaction) survey. Detailed action plans will be developed by departments. Overall, results showed improvement from the 2006 survey. (See related article.)
- Dr. Boucree highlighted several important quality initiatives including hand hygiene compliance, unapproved abbreviations compliance, and patient complaint reports and requests.
- Dr. Roebuck provided a presentation on the status of the Epic EMR installation and inpatient "go live" slated for later in 2011. He highlighted that SportsCare is already "live" and things are working well.
- An appeal for contributions to the "Dr. Farouk N. Obeid Trauma Bay Fund" for the new Hurley ER was made by the Foundation's Major Gifts Officer, Colleen Mansour.
- Dr. Boucree announced election results. (See related article.)
- Dr. Katneni provided a presentation regarding Hurley's patient satisfaction physician component scores.
 Interactive discussion ensued with regard to opportunities for improvement.

Patient and Family-Centered Care Update



The PFCC Partnership Council was formed in July and has been meeting monthly for training since that time. The members include Hurley patients, family members and local community members that are all committed to making Hurley a better place for healthcare. Seven of the committee members traveled to North Carolina with members of Hurley staff to attend the most recent training session given by the Institute for Patient and Family-Centered Care. Everyone returned from the training engaged and excited to make improvements at Hurley. At the December meeting, the committee developed and prioritized a list of projects to complete. Each project will benefit Hurley patients and family members in a positive way. In January, members of the Hurley staff will join the partnership council to work side by side, as partners, with patient and family committee members.

The PFCC Steering Committee has been hard at work on a new patient-directed visitation policy. Once finalized, the committee will plan a communication and education strategy for introduction of the policy. Many of the committee members are also actively involved with the pilots on 7E, Pediatrics and the PICU. Family rounds with physicians, nursing and patient/family members began in the PICU on October 18th. Rounds have been very well received by parents who appreciated the increased communication about their children. Rounds are scheduled to begin on the pediatric unit and 7E right after the first of the year.

Hurley Physician Survey Results Show Improvement


Hurley Medical Center is committed to enhancing the quality of care and making Hurley a better place for physicians to practice medicine. Recently physicians were asked to participate in a telephone survey to help hospital leadership better understand physician perceptions of Hurley. We thank you for taking the time to complete the survey.

The results are in with 83% of Hurley active and provisional physicians showing their commitment to this institution by participating.

While the survey covered a number of service and clinical areas of the hospital, there are two overall perception questions about Hurley Medical Center: Quality of Care and As a Place to Practice Medicine.

From the above results, we are pleased to report over a third of the physicians rated Hurley Medical Center as Excellent in delivering patient care and in embodying an exceptional medical center in which to

practice medicine, with another 42-54% seeing Hurley as Very Good. These results put Hurley in the 40th percentile of the 400+ database of hospitals for Quality of Care and the 58th percentile As A Place to Practice Medicine. Compared to our 2006 survey, there has been substantial progress. Additionally, there were virtually no areas in which we had major service recovery concerns to address.

As we continue to improve all facets of our delivery of medical care, we recognize the value and importance of working in concert with our physicians to make sure we are heading in the right direction.
