# Back-to-School Campaign Seeks to Enroll Michigan's Uninsured Kids in Health Insurance

In August, a coalition of Michigan hospitals, urban school districts and community health centers launched an intensified back-to-school campaign to enroll eligible children in the state's low-cost and free health insurance programs known as MIChild and Healthy Kids.

The eight-week campaign is part of a year-long effort of the Enroll Michigan coalition to enroll as many of Michigan's more than 127,000 uninsured and eligible children as is possible in MIChild or Healthy Kids. The fall back-to-school campaign was announced at concurrent news conferences on August 23 at Hurley Medical Center in Flint, Sparrow Health System in Lansing, Oakwood Taylor Teen Health Center in Southgate, and Burton Elementary and Middle School in Grand Rapids. The Enroll Michigan coalition includes the Michigan Primary Care Association (MPCA), the Michigan Health & Hospital Association (MHA) and the Middle Cities Education Association (MCEA).

"This care is critical for detecting health conditions at an earlier stage and ensuring healthier kids in our communities," said Patrick Wardell, President and Chief Executive Officer of Hurley Medical Center in Flint. "Introducing children to prevention and wellness also

teaches them the importance of developing healthy habits. Those lessons will last them a lifetime."

More than 127,000 children are uninsured in Michigan. While most are eligible for MIChild or Healthy Kids, they have not enrolled for reasons including language barriers, lack of transportation or means of communication (telephone access) and unawareness of eligibility and/or how to enroll. Enroll Michigan has been working since March to connect the families of eligible children to MPCA Community Navigators to complete the simplified online, telephone and in-person enrollment processes.

Families with children who have no health insurance can enroll today by emailing enroll@mpca.net, calling 2-1-1, or by visiting the Enroll Michigan website, www.enrollmichigan.com. Families can also enroll their child by calling the MPCA toll-free at 800.752.7268, and a trained staff person will take the information over the phone.

# 'They Were on Fire' New Orleans-Bound, 2012

### Veeramreddy, Veerapaneni, Sanikommu and Sharif take top prize in statewide competition

One of Hurley's resident physician teams took first place in the Doctor's Dilemma Jeopardy-style of medical competition Sept. 9 during the American College of Physicians Internal Medicine-Michigan Chapter Annual Scientific Meeting in Grand Rapids, Mich. Padmaja Veeramreddy MD (fourth-year Combined Medicine/Pediatrics resident), Narendra Veerapaneni MD and Srinivasa Sanikommu MD (both third-year Internal Medicine residents) edged out the competition to win the title of state champ for the Hurley team. Mohammad Sharif MD (third-year Internal Medicine resident) served as alternate. All four prepared for the competition.

Laura Carravallah MD, director of the Combined Medicine/ Pediatrics Residency Program at Hurley, posted news of their win, along with a photo, to the "HMC Housestaff" Facebook page (a closed group just for Hurley house staff physicians). "They were on fire!" she wrote.

Ghassan Bachuwa MD, director of the Internal Medicine Residency Program at Hurley, sent the news via his iPad. "Great job!" he wrote. "We are very proud of you. Hope for the first place at the national. Pack your bags for next year!"

The win earned the team an all-expense-paid trip to the ACP Internal Medicine 2012 conference in New Orleans April 19-21, 2012, where they will represent the Michigan region in the competition for the national championship title. Up to 40 teams of residents from around the nation are expected, according to the ACP Internal Medicine Doctor's Dilemma web page.

The Hurley team earned the right to compete in the Michigan statewide competition by winning the Doctor's Dilemma Competition during the regional ACP Associates Day May 20, 2011, in Ann Arbor.

EpicCare Link will provide your office with secure Web-based access to information about the care your patients receive at Hurley Medical Center.

By having access to EpicCare Link you will be able to follow the progress of care for patients that you have referred to us and improve your ability to coordinate ongoing care. It also allows for printing and scanning of records in your practice which can eliminate unnecessary phone calls.

One of the great features of this product is the secure messaging function that

will allow physicians to offer electronic consults. EpicCare Link also will make the process of referring patients faster and more efficient.

To ensure all office personnel have access to this new service, the following will need to be completed and faxed to 810.760.9956:

- 1. HIPAA Privacy and Security Certificate of Completion (if you currently have a MRIS, sign on code please go to www.hurleymc.com, click on staff portal and click on HealthStream, to update your HIPAA and/or print certificate of completion)
- 2. Confidentiality Statement
- 3. Sign on Code Form

Upon completion, a sign on code form will be provided to each individual that has completed the form.

We are also asking that each office consider appointing an administrator for EpicCare Link. The administrator will be responsible for:

- 1. Ensuring that user ids and passwords are updated as employees are hired or leave the practice.
- 2. Making sure staff has completed HIPAA training on an annual basis.


# **Hurley Foundation Trauma Center Golf Classic** is a Success

# PREMISYS – New Access Control System Requires Badge Updates

Hurley Medical Center is in the process of converting to a new access control system called PREMISYS. It will require that all card holders receive a new ID badge. The new



badge will contain the old bar codes along with a chip inside to use on the new readers that will be installed in the second phase. The badge will work with both systems.

A second bar code has been added to work with Epic. Any person that will be accessing Epic for clinical means will need to have the second Epic number plus the second bar code.

Physician Services is working with Public Safety to minimize the impact of obtaining a new badge for physicians. All physician photos on file were shared with Public Safety to create new badges. These new badges will all have "PHYSICIAN" as the title. Beginning October 6, representatives from Physician Services will be delivering the new badges in exchange for the old ones.

# **Hurley Joins the Institute for Healthcare** Improvement's Project **JOINTS Initiative - Only** Hospital in Genesee

Hurley has joined the Institute for Healthcare Improvement's Project JOINTS initiative, a federally-funded program designed to speed adoption of proven methods to prevent surgical site infections (SSIs) after hip and knee replacement surgery. Michigan is one of five states participating in the first stage of this threeyear project. Project JOINTS stands for "Joining Organizations IN Tackling SSI."

"Patients are not getting the best care reliably enough," said Maureen Bisognano, President and CEO of the Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI). "It can take years from the publication of evidencebased advancements to when patients can reap the benefits. Patients deserve better. Organizations taking part in Project JOINTS are dedicated to accelerating the spread of practices shown to protect patients from potentially devastating infections."

Launched in April of 2011, Project JOINTS is focusing on hip and knee replacement surgery because infections following these procedures can be catastrophic for the patient and those caring for them. Treatment can mean multiple surgeries, months of medical and physical therapy, prolonged periods of recuperation, and often considerable pain and sizeable out-of-pocket expenses. For some, permanent disability and long-term financial problems are the results.

"With over 1.1 million procedures done in 2008, knee and hip replacements are two of the most commonly performed surgeries in the US. Depending upon patient risk, it is estimated that between 6,000 and 20,000 SSIs occur annually after these types of surgeries and the number is predicted to rise substantially in coming years due to an aging population staying more active.

Hurley is dedicated to the care of a variety of orthopedic injuries; our unique setting promotes wellness and maximizes patient recovery with one-on-one patient care tailored to each individual's needs. Beginning in October, Hurley is implementing five evidence-based practices designed to prevent SSIs in patients undergoing hip and knee replacement surgery," says Sidney Martin, MD, Orthopedic Surgeon on staff at Hurley and Family Orthopedic Associates.

Three of the five evidence-based practices are based on newer evidence:

- Patient bathing or showering with a special antibacterial soap for at least three days before surgery
- Screening patients for the presence of Staph prior to surgery and treating those testing positive
- Preparing skin at the surgical site with an antiseptic solution that contains alcohol

Two of the five practices are based on more well-known SSI prevention practices:

- Reliably giving the appropriate antibiotics to the patient before starting surgery
- Avoiding shaving hair at the surgical site

more efficient and effective ways.


