
Hurley Physicians Champion for Men's Health

Hurley Medical Center Launches First Ever Men's Health Initiative –Transforming Men's Health in Mid-Michigan

Is a man's car more Important than his health? Men change their oil every 3,000 miles. But when it comes to their own health, for many reasons they are reluctant to get a health tune-up. Men not only fail to get routine check-ups or preventive care, but often ignore symptoms or delay seeking medical attention when sick or in pain. On January 20, 2012, the media were invited to attend the launch of the Hurley first ever Men's Health Initiative event, held inside Charles White Conference Center.

Johnny McClendon, a Hurley employee, took charge of his own health after he became winded playing with his 4-year-old son. After a year of consistent strength training and moderate nutrition changes, McClendon has gone from 326 pounds to 239 pounds, decreased his waist size from 50" to 38" and went from a 5XLT to a 1XLT shirt size. Says Johnny, "This is a new way of life, and I am so thankful to Hurley and their

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On March 4, 2012, Hurley will bring to close two years of effort by the implementation team. Hundreds of people across the organization will be bringing Epic live and replacing current systems and processes for all of our clinical users. This will involve a lot of changes for everyone, but changes that will benefit our patients, physicians and our organization.

So what exactly will be changing?

- Patient charts will no longer be on paper, but will instead be electronic. Care providers will be able to access the patient chart from anywhere we have a computer and at any time. It will even be possible to access the patient record from off-site or remote offices with internet access.
- Medication and blood products will be delivered utilizing bar code support. Patients will have new wristbands with barcodes, medications and blood product will have barcodes, and all of the new badges have bar codes, enabling a three step process to be quickly documented ensuring that the right medications are delivered to the right patient.
- Lab and other results will file immediately and directly to the patient chart with notifications for results being sent to physician in-baskets, so they are notified and have a chance to review new results quickly and efficiently.
- Patients will have schedules available to view, that allow their care team to better plan their time and involvement. Surgeries, procedures, therapies, and other services such as case management can also be seen.

Of course, those are just some of the highlights of the many changes. At the beginning, we said that we were bringing to a close two years of effort, but we're starting up a whole new project of optimization of the system that we've worked with you to build. We are looking forward to a continued partnership, for years into the future.

Epic Pre-Go-Live Open Lab

If you've been to Epic training and want to pre-set your preferences – we have open labs for you!

Beginning on January 30th, open labs have been established for physicians to come in and work with our trainers to establish your Preference Lists (orders), Order Sets & Patient Lists within Epic. These are open labs so there is no on-line registration – it is by "drop-in" only.

Requirements for entry to lab:

- Must have completed at least one Epic MD class: MD100 or for previously trained physicians - MD200, MDOB200 or MDSurgery200
- Must have completed at least one proficiency exam
- Your Active Directory ID/password must be active & known to you (ID & password needs to be brought to the session)

EpicCare Link

EpicCare Link is a web-based application for connecting organizations to community practices. It will provide community users secure access to select patient information. While users of EpicCare Link will not receive full access to Epic's applications, they are allowed read-only access to view their patient's charts.

EpicCare Link is not an EMR solution. It is a read-only application with some service-oriented features that can be configured to facilitate business with community practices.

What business interests can EpicCare Link address?

Referral Communication

Community physicians will primarily use EpicCare Link to view the patient medical record and documentation completed after they have referred a patient to Hurley.

Patient Notifications

Community physicians will receive convenient notifications on their Home screen when certain significant events occur involving their patients, such as being admitted to or discharged from the hospital.

Image Ordering

EpicCare Link permits users to enter procedure orders for Imaging studies. This ordering workflow helps community physicians better manage their patients' care as they will obtain the result for the study they ordered in EpicCare Link and won't have to wait for a faxed/mailed copy.

EpicCare Link does not require classroom training, however it does require you sign-up and receive a username and password. If you would like access to EpicCare Link but haven't submitted a request, please contact Regina Waller at 810.262.7302.

Orthopedic Surgeon Dr. Sidney Martin Returns Home After Deployment to Afghanistan

Dr. Sidney Martin, an orthopedic surgeon at Hurley Medical Center and Flint Orthopedic Associates, recently returned from a month-long stint in Kandahar, Afghanistan where he served as a commander of the 127th Medical Group with the Air National Guard. He was responsible for evaluating the medical condition of the U.S. Air Force flight crews.

Dr. Martin returned home on December 8, 2011. "I've always felt that serving our country in this way was the thing I would do," Martin said. "In July I (will) have been in the service for 24 years. I wouldn't change any of it."

Martin was commissioned into the military in 1988 when he was doing his residency at McLaren Regional Medical Center. In 1990, he attended an eight-week military flight surgery school.

This most recent deployment to Afghanistan was Martin's fourth. He was first deployed in 1991 to England for four months during Desert Storm. In 2002, Martin was deployed for four months to Afghanistan for Operation Enduring Freedom where he flew in combat missions as the flight surgeon. His third deployment sent him to Balad, the medical hub in Iraq, where he tended to injured soldiers in 2007.

One major difference stands out between practicing medicine here and in Afghanistan, Martin said.

"Over here for the most part, no one's shooting at you. Over there they're still shooting at you," he said. "I'm very lucky that I don't have to go outside the wire. ... I joke with my wife when she's worried saying 'We do get attacked on occasion, but don't worry — they're pretty bad shots.'

All joking aside, though, Martin said the hardest thing about his deployments is being away from his family, which includes wife Pam and three children, ages 24-33.

Dr. Martin still sees images of the wounds and injuries he treated in Iraq, but he said he imagines those who fight on the front lines have it much worse. Those are the real heroes, he said. But every service member has a crucial part in protecting Americans' freedoms.

"People in the military who aren't on the front lines are just as important as those who are getting shot at," he said.
"I have had the honor of caring for those who have been wounded. ... As long as I feel I can be of service to my country I will continue (to serve)."

Hurley to launch its Vascular Center in August 2012




National statistics reveal:
