Dr. Kaddurah's goal as a medical student was to become a pediatric neurologist. Growing up in a refugee camp in southern Lebanon, he recognized the shortage of pediatric specialists and made it his mission to do well in school and pursue his medical degree. "My parents taught the family early in life the value of hard work and a good education. After we were forced out of our home in Palestine, my parents sought refuge in Lebanon, to raise six children. Our humble family faced financial hardship together as a team, working three months each summer, earning money to support the family throughout the rest of the year," adds Dr. Kaddurah.

Employee/Physician Flu Vaccination Status Mandate

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) requires that EVERY employee, adult student, volunteer, licensed Independent Practitioner, and agency personnel who has worked in the medical center for one day between the October 1, 2013 through March 31, 2014 <u>must</u> declare their flu shot status (either received the flu shot or declined the flu shot).

Hurley Medical Center is proud to be partnered with Genesys and McLaren, to make your vaccination and documentation process easier. This partnership will allow the sharing of your vaccination information between all three medical centers to help everyone be in compliance.

All three hospitals will be offering free flu vaccines (contact the individual facilities for vaccine availability). Hurley Medical Center will be offering flu shots during our house-wide Blitz from September 24, 2013 through October 5, 2013. During this time, flu shots will be offered during all three shifts as well as during two consecutive weekends. Those who wish to decline the flu shot may also do so during the Blitz. Documentation of flu vaccines received in licensed independent practitioners' offices may be faxed to one of the three facilities, as CMS requires a copy of the actual vaccination form this year.

Break the Glass


As of July 23rd, attending physicians no longer have to Break the Glass to access charts.

In the mid 70's, during the civil war, Dr. Kaddurah's family moved to Beirut, Lebanon. It was here that he chose one of the most prestigious medical schools in the Middle East for his higher education. Through the assistance of academic scholarships, Dr. Kaddurah graduated medical school in 1990 from American University of Beirut.

Following medical school, Dr. Kaddurah made the choice to move to the United States to further his education and pursue better economic opportunities. In 1995 he completed his pediatric residency at State University of New York, followed by his residency in child neurology at Wayne State University, Children's Hospital of Michigan. To help fulfill a requirement for U.S. citizenship, Dr. Kaddurah then worked as a pediatrician for three years in an underserved area in Watertown, New York. During this time, Dr. Kaddurah also completed his fellowship in neurophysiology and epilepsy at University of Michigan Medical School.

Prior to joining the medical staff at Hurley, Dr. Kaddurah worked on staff at Children's Hospital of Michigan, Detroit, as a pediatric neurologist and was in charge of EEG readings. It was here that Dr. Kaddurah met Dr. Michael Nigro, Chief of Neurology, whom he credits for being his mentor and an integral part of his success. This year marks Dr. Kaddurah's ten year anniversary with Hurley Medical Center. Dr. Kaddurah is Board Certified in Psychiatry and Neurology/ Child Neurology, as well as Sleep Medicine. He currently treats child neurology and sleep medicine patients at the Hurley Pediatric Specialists Clinic and Hurley Pediatric Neurology Clinic.

Dr. Kaddurah served for four years as Co-Chair and now serves as Chair of the Hurley Annual Pediatric Update Program. He is Director, Pediatric Neurology and EEG Laboratory at Hurley Medical Center.

In a teaching capacity, Dr. Kaddurah currently serves as Associate Professor, Department of Pediatrics and Human Development, Michigan State University. Dr. Kaddurah plays a very active role in the Hurley Graduate Medical Education Program and takes pride in educating the resident physicians through their rotations here.

Dr. Kaddurah and wife, Rama, currently reside in Grand Blanc and enjoy playing an active role in the local Muslim Community. They are the proud parents of four children. Eldest son, Omar, is a wellknown athlete locally, who won two state titles in running. Omar is currently studying pre-med and psychology at the University of Michigan. Son, Hisham, is also following in his father and brothers' footsteps by pursing a pre-med degree at University of Michigan. Daughter, Sena, is ten years old and daughter, Yara, is four.

Beyond his devotion to practicing medicine and caring for his patients, Dr. Kaddurah also enjoys time with his family, jogging, swimming, tennis and reading. Soccer had been his passion, but due to injuries, he is no longer able to play. Dr. Kaddurah has family that reside all over the world, offering many areas for him to travel. He enjoys regular visits back to Lebanon to visit with his mother, as his father passed last year. He also has a sister in Sweden, a sister in Jordan and a brother in California.

The value of hard work instilled by his parents as a child, still resonates strongly with him today, keeping him busy on nights and weekends reading tests results, reviewing EEG's and working on research projects that may minimize exposure and improve outcomes for his patients. Dr. Kaddurah takes pride in the importance of his reputation amongst his colleagues, peers and patients for the quality of care and compassion he consistently delivers.
