6East Acute Care for Elders Unit Open for Patients

Hospital Care Designed to Preserve Independence and Function

Hurley Medical Center offers specialty care for elderly hospitalized patients in the Acute Care for Elders (ACE) unit. In the ACE unit, a multidisciplinary geriatric team helps older adults maintain their independence and prevent physical and mental decline during treatment for acute illnesses, with the goal of quickly returning patients to their normal living situations and routines. Research has shown that about 25 percent of frail elderly patients who are

hospitalized for common acute illnesses never return to their pre-hospitalization living situation due to unmet care needs.

The ACE Model of Care Involves:

Multidisciplinary rounds with specialized ACE team whose members review risk factors for decline and make recommendations to minimize such risks.

Discharge planning that begins upon admission, with a geriatric order set that provides a uniform starting point for all patients.



Proven geriatric care principles used to monitor the functional needs of each patient on a daily basis via comprehensive assessments addressing all disorders.

- Admissions assessment, including upfront discharge planning
- Emotional, nutritional and memory assessments
- Mobility assessment to determine the need for assistance and to create rehabilitation plan
- Review of medications to ensure proper dose and avoid complications

Dr. Mona Hanna-Attisha Named Member of Public Health Code Advisory Committee





In his 2011 special Health and
Wellness Message, Governor Rick
Snyder called on the Michigan
Department of Community
Health (MDCH) to perform a
comprehensive review of the
Michigan Public Health Code.
MDCH is pleased to announce that
it recently formed the Public Health
Code Advisory Committee and
appointed Lawrence Burns, JD of
Varnum LLP in Grand Rapids, Mich. as
chairman of the effort to review the
Public Health Code.

"The health care environment has changed dramatically since the Public Health Code was enacted 35 years ago. This is an opportunity to better align the Code's requirements with the way health care services are delivered today, and in the future. The MDCH has selected an excellent committee of professionals, each with a unique perspective and I am honored to serve on this committee." adds Mona Hanna-Attisha MD, MPH, FAAP, Director, Pediatric Residency Program Hurley Children's Hospital and Michigan State University College of Human.

The Michigan Public Health Code was enacted in 1978, creating the regulatory framework for health care in Michigan. Over time, a significant number of amendments have altered the Public Health Code, but many are now outdated, and many new issues have arisen since then, that are not addressed in the Code. Governor Snyder has charged MDCH and the newly-appointed Public HealthCode Advisory Committee with conducting a systematic review of the Code and submitting recommendations for regulatory changes.

The Public Health Code Advisory Committee began meeting in August 2013 to review the code and plans to involve an electronic process for input from stakeholders and the public. The Committee is aiming to have a comprehensive report of recommendations to the MDCH Director by early 2014.


Distinction of Excellence
