Transcranial Doppler Exams

The EEG department has paired with Radiology to form a team in the collection and interpretation of Transcranial Doppler (TCD) ultrasound studies. TCD measures the physiologic parameters of blood flow in the cerebral arteries and is employed as a dynamic, reliable and reproducible diagnostic to assess intracranial circulation, with immediate results.

Some accepted applications for TCD include:

- Detection of severe stenosis(>65%) of the intracranial arteries in stroke and TIA patients
- Early detection of vasospasm in patients with subarachnoid hemorrhage
- Adjunct for assessment of cerebral circulatory arrest
- Assessment of the patterns of collateral circulation in patients with known severe stenosis or occlusion
- Special test program for Sickle Cell disease in pediatric patients (STOP)



Testing is done on both an inpatient and outpatient basis. Inpatient orders for TCD should be placed in Epic as Transcran Dopp complete or by calling the EEG Department at 810.262.9303. Results may be viewed in EPIC by selecting the Imaging tab. To schedule an outpatient exam, please call the EEG Department at 810.262.9303.

Meaningful Use: Prepare for Attestation

December 31, 2013, is an important deadline for eligible professionals (EPs) participating in the EHR Incentive Programs. It marks the end of the calendar year and the last day of the 2013 meaningful use program year.

Attestation Deadline

If you are an EP participating in the Medicare EHR Incentive Program, you have until February 28, 2014, to attest to demonstrating meaningful use of the data collected during the reporting period for the 2013 calendar year. If you are participating in the Medicaid EHR Incentive Program, please visit www.michiganhealthit.org online for attestation information.

You must attest to demonstrating meaningful use **every year** to receive an incentive and avoid a payment adjustment.

Payment Adjustments

Payment adjustments will be applied beginning January 1, 2015, if you have not successfully demonstrated meaningful use. The adjustment is determined by the reporting period in a prior year.

If you are eligible to participate in **both** the Medicare and Medicaid EHR Incentive Programs, you **MUST** demonstrate meaningful use to avoid the payment adjustments. You may demonstrate meaningful use under either Medicare or Medicaid.

If you are only eligible to participate in the Medicaid EHR Incentive Program, you are not subject to these payment adjustments.

EPs in 2014

January 1, 2014 marks many important milestones for EPs participating in the EHR Incentive Programs, including:

- The start of Stage 2 for EPs who have already completed at least two years of Stage 1
- The last year that Medicare EPs can begin participation and earn an incentive
- A 3-month reporting period in 2014, regardless of the stage of meaningful use, to allow time to upgrade to 2014 certified EHR technology
 - Medicare EPs beyond their first year of meaningful use must select a three-month reporting period fixed to the quarter of the calendar year
 - Medicare EPs in their first year of meaningful use may select any 90-day reporting period that falls within the 2014 calendar year
 - Medicaid EPs can select any 90-day reporting period that falls within the 2014 calendar year



On November 9, Hurley hosted a FREE Teen Heart Check event for students ages 13 through 19 at Clio High School. More than 260 teens were screened during the six-hour special screening event.



This special program offers an in-depth heart screening that includes a medical history, blood pressure check and an ECG. Echocardiograms were also provided, if needed. The screening looks for evidence of hypertrophic cardiomyopathy, a serious condition that can cause sudden cardiac death in young athletes, as well as in students engaging in physical activity or exercise.
