# Hurley Opens Doors On Region's 1st Food Pharmacy, Creating New Program To Address Food Insecurity: Media Invited August 1, 2017 For Tour, Grand Opening & Ribbon Cutting

At Hurley, we are steadfastly committed to the people of our community, from infants to seniors and everyone in between. More than a hospital, we are our community's partner. Through several collaborations with community partners, Hurley is helping Genesee and surrounding counties improve population health.

The Community Foundation of Greater Flint has authorized a grant of \$50,000 to the Hurley Foundation from the Arthur L. Tuuri Health Fund to be used for the Hurley Medical Center Food Pharmacy.

Hurley worked with the Greater Flint Health Coalition, Genesys, and McLaren of Flint in developing a joint Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) in 2016. This CHNA is completed every three years and helps communities focus efforts on priority health needs.

One such priority health need that Hurley has committed to address is: Food Insecurity.

Alisa Craig, MS, Hurley Administrator of Wellness & Population Health, states, "Hunger is truly a health issue. Many of our patients cannot appropriately recover from surgeries/hospital stays or manage their chronic conditions because they often do not have enough food, especially healthy food, to help them heal. In addition, many often have to choose between purchasing medications or purchasing food."

The USDA defines Food Insecurity as: "the state of being without reliable access to sufficient quantity of affordable, nutritious food." The rate of food insecure families in the U.S. continues to rise and, in Genesee County, the rates are higher than the national average. Food insecurity is one of the primary social determinants of health that can have a tremendous impact on a patient's



ability to manage a chronic condition or fight illness. It is estimated that direct healthcare costs related to hunger nationwide are \$155 billion annually. Two very vulnerable populations are Children and Older Adults.

- Children, who live in households that are food insecure, recover more slowly from illness, have poorer overall health, and are hospitalized more frequently.
- An older adult experiencing very low food security is nine times more likely to skip medications to save money than one who is fully food secure.

Hurley will begin to consistently address food insecurity in our patient population by implementing routine screening for food insecurity via our electronic medical record. A positive screening will then generate a referral to our Food Pharmacy, which will be located at our Eastside campus, within our Diabetes Center, at 2700 Robert T. Longway Blvd in Flint.

Our mission is to increase access to healthy foods for our food insecure patients and provide them with specific community resources to assist them long-term. The referral to the Food Pharmacy will provide 2 days' worth of healthy food for themselves and their household members and can be used twice monthly, for three months. Patients will also be provided follow-up resources to help with their nutrition and other health-related needs and be able to meet with a registered dietitian.

To start, the Food Pharmacy will be open three days per week (Tuesdays 9a-1p, Wednesdays 11a-3p, and Thursdays 2-6p). No appointment is needed but their health care provider must have referred the patients.

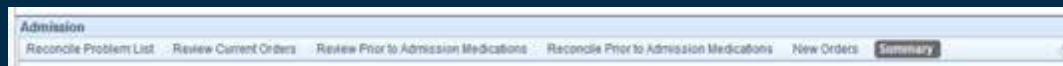

# Order Reconciliation for Physicians & Mid – Levels

To Start “Click” Admission Orders from the Admission Navigator then follow the tabs from left to right....



**Step 1:** Reconcile Problem List

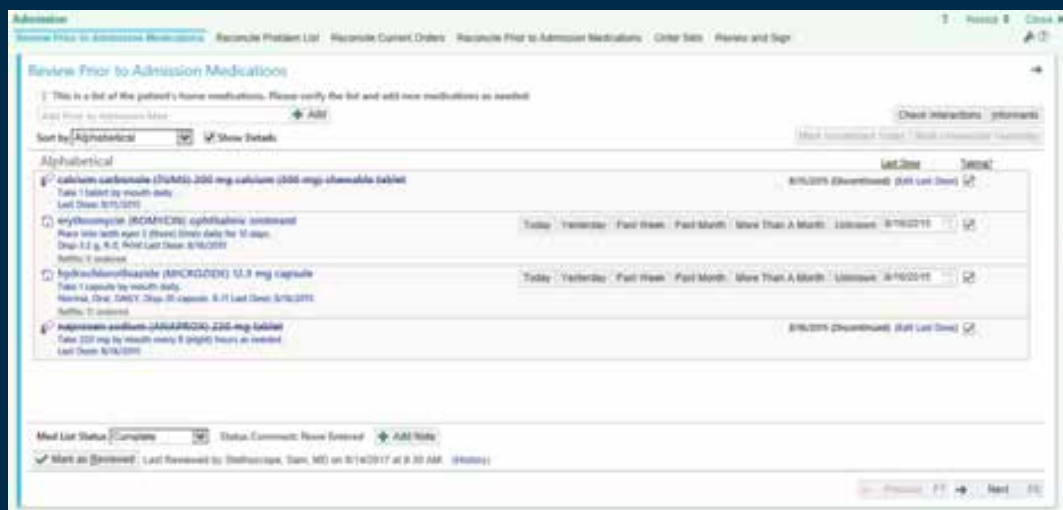
**Step 2:** Review Current Orders: Go through each order decided if it should continue after admission. When the header for Orders Need Reconciliation on the right is green review is complete (red– orders need to be reconciled).

**Step 3:** Reconcile Prior to Admission Medications: This section addresses the patients home medications. Again, the header on the right is green this section is complete.

**Step 4:** Order Sets: This is where you will place any additional needed orders for admission.

**Step 5:** Summary: From here you will review all of the decisions that were made during the reconciliation workflow. Make sure there are no hard stops left. Once your review is complete click Sign & Hold-Will Be Initiated by Receiving Unit if this patient is in ED, or if not in ED the button will read “sign”. At discharge you will be required to enter in your password, but this is the only time you will be required to enter your password when ordering.

Review Prior to Admission Medications: If during the medication reconciliation process you determine the home medication list is not up to date you can modify that list from this tab.

### New State of Michigan, Department of Community Health Bureau of Health Professions

### New Public Health Code and Administrative Rules Require Human Trafficking Training:

Licensees and individuals seeking licensure to complete human trafficking training. Beginning with the March 2019 renewal cycle, and all renewal cycles thereafter, licensees must have completed training in identifying victims of human trafficking that meet the standards established in Administrative Rule 338.6103.

## NEW! Continuing Education Requirements For Michigan Medical Doctors

**Authority: Public Act 368 of 1978, as amended**

### REQUIREMENTS FOR RENEWAL

Each medical doctor is required to complete 150 hours of continuing education in courses or programs approved by the board of which a minimum 75 hours of the required 150 hours must be earned in courses or programs designated as Category 1 programs.

**A minimum of 1 hour of continuing education must be earned in the area of medical ethics. Effective December 6, 2017 a minimum of 3 hours of continuing education must be earned in the area of pain and symptom management.**
