Looking at the status of nursing jobs in Genesee County it is unfortunate that we have one of the worst unemployment rates in Michigan. However, the Department of Labor and Economic Growth projects Registered Nurses as the 2nd top jobs for growth by 2014. (#1 is Medical Assistants and #3 is Post secondary Teachers).⁽¹⁾ As fellow alumni members it is our job to encourage young men and women to pursue nursing as a profession- the opportunities are endless. The cost of education can be a prohibiting factor in one pursuing a nursing education. The average cost for a student to achieve a 4-year degree is about \$40,000. This does not include the pre-requisites, books or supplies. So consider a donation to the alumni scholarship fund. It is very rewarding to know you made a difference.

The theme for nurses week this year was *Nursing, A Profession and a Passion*. Think back on why you chose nursing as a profession and how difficult it would have been if you did not have the passion. I recently changed jobs to work as a Nurse Navigator in the Breast Center. Message from the UM-Flint Department of Nursing Director.....

During the past three years, UM-Flint has experienced marked enrollment increases as the nursing faculty have attempted to keep pace with the growing demand for nurses and nurse practitioners. There currently are 6,256 students enrolled at UM-Flint. Nursing comprises the largest program within the School of Health Professions and Studies with undergraduate and graduate enrollments totaling 427. In the past three years Nursing has enjoyed a 45% increase in pre-nursing enrollments; 17% growth in the basic BSN program; 41% increase in the pre-RN/BSN program; 23% increase in the RN/BSN program; and a 65% increase in the graduate nursing program.

On May 7th UM-F admitted its first cohort of 27 *Second Degree or Second Career* students. Individuals who have earned a bachelor's degree in another field can earn their BSN by studying in a 2 calendar year program which means that courses are taken during the Spring and Summer semesters as well as the regular academic year. Those who began the program in May include individuals with bachelor's degrees in a wide variety of disciplines including biology, psychology, social work, engineering, criminal justice, and other fields. Two of the current students have earned master's degrees in other disciplines. These highly motivated and goal-directed individuals will finish their studies in Spring 2009 after completing the same curriculum as the current traditional BSN students. Pending approval by state and national accrediting organizations UM-F will offer an *Accelerated Second Degree or Second Career Program* which will require 16 months of full-time study to complete. This new program will begin next year.

Among the pillars of the UM-F curriculum is commitment to developing students who are *engaged citizens*. During the past year, Nursing majors provided healthcare services to underserved populations in Peru and the Dominican Republic under the guidance and mentorship of nursing faculty member Maureen Tippen. Plans are under way to expand the international travel/study opportunities to include Cambodia next year. UM-Flint Nursing majors have also demonstrated their engaged citizenship by raising more than \$1,000 (literally one penny at a time) to support the Genesee County Free Clinic.

On April 29th the University of Michigan-Flint awarded 49 BSN degrees, 32 for successful completion of the traditional or basic 4-year program & 17 to graduates of the RN-BSN program. There were 9 graduates of the Family and Adult Nurses Practitioner MSN Programs.

UM-Flint nursing faculty have endeavored to continue the tradition of excellence begun by the Hurley School of Nursing faculty. In the Fall 2006 and Winter 2007, 100% of UM-Flint graduates passed the NCLEX-RN licensure exam on their first attempt. Similarly we had a 100% first-time pass rate for master's graduates taking the American Nurses Credentialing Center's national credentialing exam for nurse practitioners.

On behalf of the UM-F faculty, students and staff, I would like to thank the board members and membership of the Hurley Medical Center School of Nursing Alumni Association for your continued support of UM-Flint.

She is proud to be very independent, living in a Villa after her husband Henry died and she says "no wheelchair for me!" She keeps up on her registration and maintains her CEU's. Interview with Rachel Rhea (Dean) Fitch

Class of 1934

Rhea (as she is called) gave us an interview (and sharp as a tack at the age of 96) from her perspective of Hurley as she experienced it in 1934. She had an excellent memory for many of her fond "Hurley days". She started Hurley School of Nursing in 1931 under the direction of Mrs. Wilhelmine Zeigler. Rhea recalls she was "STRICT" but nice. Tuition cost \$40.00 and each student was given one white nursing dress. She states, "that she studied hard, rarely went out on dates or did anything that she wasn't suppose to do". She does recall, running up the sidewalk of the school as fast as she could a few times to "beat the curfew" so she would not get any "late minutes" and be grounded.

Her nursing career included working several years on the 4th floor unit (women's surgical unit), working in ER and being a supervisor on the 9th floor working with Helen Delay until 1963. She left Hurley to work at the Visiting Nurses Association until the age of 72 yrs. Rhea recalled working very hard for 3 straight days / nights during the 1953 Beecher tornado.

She also recalled Dr. Fleetwood as an intern on 9th floor and "showing him the ropes." Dr. Fleetwood is presently the physician at the Tender Care Nursing Health Care Center in Frankenmuth, MI. on N. Genesee St. where Rhea resided during the interview.

Her dedication to nursing has always been one of her greatest joys in life. Her daughter, Jacquelyn Acre, said, "her mother has always been a very giving person, baking fantastic apple pies, making potato salads and giving them away to friends."

Unfortunately 2 weeks after this interview, Rhea fell and broke her hip and died a short time later. We are grateful to have had the opportunity to share in her enthusiasm when speaking of the memories of her days at Hurley School of Nursing.
